



A function will be held in Downer Square, at which Minister Rachel Stephen-Smith will speak about the background of community involvement in the recent refurbishment of Downer Square, and the bronze kangaroo sculpture previously located in the Downer Primary School courtyard. The ACT Government has commissioned WA artist April Pine to provide a kangaroo sculpture as part of the Square refurbishment, and the new sculpture and a commemorative plaque will be unveiled at the function.

Come along and have a pleasant time in the square! Bring a picnic, or eat at Gang Gang café, who have organised live music for the evening. <u>Note that there will be a media event</u> at 9 am on the same day, at which the artist will be present in addition to the Minister.

Transport Canberra Information Session Downer Community Centre, Wednesday 10 April, 7-8:30 pm

Come along to a Transport Canberra information session on the new public transport timetables and how they will affect Downer residents.

As you may be aware, Transport Canberra is designing a new system to integrate buses and light rail timetables in our area. This has implications for the bus route through Downer (new bus 50 will run through the suburb), and making connections via the new Dickson Bus Interchange and the Light Rail stop on Northbourne Avenue for travel to and from Civic or Gungahlin. Downer residents can also access 2 adjacent rail stops (Swinden St and Phillip Ave) and the new Rapid 9 bus to Belconnen.

The main part of the session will provide information about the new timetables, which should be available online and in hard copy by the time this newsletter is distributed (if not by then, they will be available by 10 April – please check <u>https://www.transport.act.gov.au/</u>.

Session attendees will be able to raise questions about the new travel journey routes, timetables for our area and getting to their destinations across Canberra. Large route maps of the whole new network will also be available for inspection.
