# What is happening about the derelict Downer Shops? How might local residents be involved in seeking a better future for this site?

As the former Downer shops continue to degrade and memories of the facility become dimmer, the DCA Committee has determined that 2011 will be the year in which some action is taken to resolve the future of this area. If the current owner is unwilling to do anything with the site, the Government needs to intervene to ensure that the current hiatus around the vandalised building is addressed, so that its use is restored to the local community.

To this end, a series of discussions has been taking place with ACTPLA and other Government agencies involved, to get action on the former shops site and the associated wider central Downer area.

We have already gone through several planning exercises for this area with the Government, including the Downer Neighbourhood Plan, the Central Downer Urban Design Study and the Downer Primary School Former School Site Study. While these have been useful, nothing concrete has actually resulted from these consultations. The DCA believes the community should be able to expect better planning outcomes for the area. We are not against development, but want to ensure that, in the process, the needs of the community are respected.

Nevertheless, there have been some recent positive steps towards agreement between all parties involved. Whether the original CS and IR building which housed the former shops can be saved is still under discussion. It seems likely that the former Downer Primary School site will undergo some form of higher density redevelopment.

The DCA sees the resolution of these significant issues as priorities for 2011. If you want to participate and make your views heard, a working group will be meeting on the second Monday of every month, at 7:30 pm in the Downer Community Centre (1st meeting, Monday 14th March).

If you want further information, background documents (including the submissions the DCA has made to the various studies undertaken for central Downer in the past) will be available on the DCA website.
