

## Follow-up from Downer's 50th

- Information has been coming in since April to be included in the CD, a sequel to the book 'Downer@50'. The CD will be officially launched at the AGM on 29th November. Note that you will not be able to 'play' the CD on a normal domestic CD or DVD player. Text and photos will be viewable on a computer monitor (PC or Mac), and a limited number of printed copies will be made available for those who do not wish to use a computer. However, for reasons of cost, these will not be professionally printed, as was the case for 'Downer@50'. However, the printed copy will cost more than the CD.
- ACT Heritage has agreed to erect a sign commemorating the Downer Mural painted on the western wall of the Community Centre. This will provide information about the significance of the mural and, hopefully, alert other artists to the fact that it should not be defaced, or painted over. Genuine artists usually respect each others work.

# **Planning Issues**

- Many residents will be aware that 17 new apartments have been erected on the corner of Bradfield and Frencham Streets. DCA made a submission to ACTPLA on the original design of these, and we are disappointed with the standard of the finished product. A similar development of 19 apartments is planned on the next 3 blocks in Frencham St, and DCA has made comments to ACTPLA on this as well. We are aware that other residents have also made separate submissions to ACTPLA.
- DCA has also made a submission on DV303, which includes proposed changes to the planning laws, some of which have the potential to change the character of our suburb.



# **Downer Community Centre User Profile**

#### This Newsletter we are featuring: SEE-Change

SEE-Change emerged from the work of two much-admired ANU academics. Professor Stephen Boyden for many years researched the subject of human-earth relations, and wrote about the potential for community centres ('Life Centres') in which citizens of all ages and backgrounds could work together to learn from each other. Professor Bob Douglas knew Stephen's work, and in 2006 assembled a round-table to talk about making this dream a reality. SEE-Change was born (The SEE stands for Society, Environment, Economy).

Stephen had envisaged physical centres, buildings in which people could meet and share knowledge, which could house a shared collection of useful resources to help citizens change their lifestyles. Such venues are not yet a part of SEE-Change (although our central office in Downer is a start), but suburb-based activities have always been at the core of SEE-Change. We see our role as one of enabling groups of citizens to work together on projects that matter to them, and we have several groups which meet all over Canberra to do just that.

Woden's focus has been on community education, and continues to foster a wonderful array of skill-sharing and knowledgesharing events and workshops. The Inner North group has shown itself to excel at running community events that bring people together on topics of sustainability (movie nights, fairs, open house days). The Inner South group writes well-researched submissions to government inquiries, offering intelligent community perspectives on ACT Government plans. And our Belconnen group has co-ordinated two solar panel bulk buys and a bike trailer hire program.

SEE-Change Inc maintains an office at the Downer Community Centre and coordinates annual reviews, webpage services, financial services, a membership system, a newsletter and annual student internships.
